

How much does it cost?

All members pay an annual subs fee:

Subscriptions 2010-2011	
Senior players	£70
Junior players	£35
Family membership	£100
Non-playing	£10

Players then pay a match fee every time they play:

Match Fees 2010-11	
Senior players	£7.50
Junior players	£5.50
Mixed matches	£4.00
Practice (if not playing on previous Saturday)	£2.00

We can't play hockey without umpires. If you're an experienced player and fancy blowing a whistle for us, we'll pay for you to be trained!

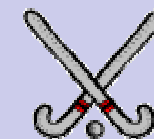

Background

Fry's Hockey Club has been established for over 30 years; the club house is Fry Club on the grounds of the Cadbury/Fry's factory.



Although we have a strong historical link with the Fry's factory and an ongoing relationship with the Fry Club, the Hockey Club is for the whole community. It's the only local club and is ideally placed between Bristol and Bath.

It offers three ladies' teams, two men's team and a mixed team. Home games are all played at Wellsway School in Keynsham.

We welcome players of all ages and abilities. We have well established **child protection** and **safe guarding** procedures and are always looking to keep these up to date with best practice.

Matches and Training

Men's and Ladies' winter league matches are played on Saturdays between September and April with a short break over the new year. Mixed games are on Sunday mornings. There is also a summer league which is played mid-week. The times of league matches vary from week to week.

Training is every Wednesday during the winter league season.

Junior training runs from 6pm-7pm for boys and girls aged roughly 12-14.

Ladies' training runs from 6.30pm-8pm.
Men's training runs from 7.30pm-9pm.



What kit is required?

Fry's Hockey Club play in a navy blue top, shorts (for men) or skirt/skort (for ladies) and socks. The club top and socks are sold by the club for £15 and £5 respectively.

You'll also need a hockey stick, a pair of shin guards and ideally a gum shield and pair of astro trainers.

The social side

Whilst we play hard on the pitch, Fry's has a strong social side to it too.

The two main events during the year are the Christmas Party and the Presentation Night at the end of the season.
